# GOVERNING BOARD UNOFFICIAL MINUTES REGULAR MEETING TUESDAY, August 22, 2023

#### **REGULAR MEETING**

#### 1. Call to Order and Roll Call

The Tolleson Union High School District No. 214 Governing Board Public Hearing was called to order at 6:00 PM by Governing Board President, Dr. Elda Luna-Najera, with the following members in attendance: Dr. Kino Flores, Vice President, Mr. Steven Chapman, Mr. Devin Del Palacio and Mr. Freddie Villalon (attending telephonically).

#### 2. Pledge of Allegiance

Dr. Luna-Najera led the pledge of allegiance.

#### 3. Approval of the Regular Agenda

Mr. Del Palacio moved to approve the Regular Agenda; seconded by Mr. Chapman. In a roll call vote, the motion carried 5-0.

#### 4. CELEBRATIONS

• Mr. Derek Fahleson, Chief Operations Officer, provided an update on the Operations Department consisting of Activities, Arts, Athletics, Intervention, Prevention, Safety, Security, and Supports. Ms. Misti Andrews, Prevention Coordinator, presented on the Intervention, Prevention, and Supports piece. Mr. Fahleson introduced his staff, Ms. Misti Andrews and Ms. Noemi Herrera, Admin Assistant; in absence recognized Ms. Traci Waling, previous Admin Assistant, who has helped in the training of Ms. Herrera. He celebrated the increasing support of Performing Arts, Capital upgrades rotations from site to site; adding additional sports as desired by the students and increased participation.

Ms. Andrews presented information on the multi-tiered systems of support which include Tier I – Universal Supports for all students, Tier II – Targeted Supports for Early Intervention, and Tier III – Individualized Targeted Intervention. She also shared grants received: 5-year grant with Touchstone Health Services (\$1.8 million per year), GOYFF Partnership with Southwest Behavioral Health (\$270,430.00), and Project Aware Grant (\$49,742.40).

Mr. Fahleson also shared information about safety and security. Mr. Fahleson recognized his entire team including the assistant principals for activities/arts/athletics, assistant principals for prevention/intervention, social workers, and interventionists.

#### 5. SUMMARY OF CURRENT EVENTS

#### **Superintendent Calles Comments**

- Superintendent Calles shared every school in our district had their respective Parent Nights, where the parents were invited to visit their child's school and follow their students' schedule to meet each teacher personally. Parent Nights play a pivotal role in high schools by fostering a strong partnership between educators, parents, and students. These events offer a unique platform for parents to connect with teachers and administrators, gaining valuable insights into their child's academic progress. He personally had the opportunity to visit Copper Canyon High School and saw different stations set-up in the common areas where parents could gather additional information and assistance ie., ParentVue. He stated he would like to work on strategies on how the schools could increase parent participation but overall it was a great and positive event.
- The 2023 Celebration of Success Kick-Off Program for JAG (Jobs for Arizona Graduates) was recently held at Coronado High School. We were happy to have many students and staff members recognized. Serving as one of the Masters of Ceremonies was Angel Gonzalez, Senior at West Point High School. Also speaking at the event was Arianna Guerra, the State Career Association President, also from West Point High School. Also, front and center was Frida Medrano Ibarra, NCA President-Elect, recent graduate from Copper Canyon High School.

Six of our high schools were honored as part of the 6-of-6 Programs. In addition, Brecklyn Edwards from West Point High School was honored as a High Performer. Ryan Klem was honored as an Outstanding Specialist from West Point High School.

Years of service awards were given to Chris Kallmes from Westview High School and Ryan Klem.

Tolleson Union High School District currently has seven programs running in the District, under the direction of Ms. Christina Boston. Mr. Calles challenged the District to win so the District could host this event in the future. Congratulations to all!

 Mr. Calles asked Dr. Tyrone V. Hall to come up to the podium to be recognized. On Aug. 10, in Arlington, Virginia, Retired U.S. Marine Corps Chief Warrant Officer 3, Dr. Tyrone V. Hall, was recognized for his work and awarded the Marine Corps JROTC National Instructor of the Year award.

Dr. Hall was selected for the award for demonstrating "superb leadership and instructional aptitude," as well as having "displayed exceptional professionalism and unparalleled proficiency at Tolleson Union High School."

This annual award is presented to a Marine Instructor or Senior Marine instructor for showing excellence and exemplifying outstanding performance within the JROTC community.

Congratulations to Dr. Hall for this amazing achievement. We appreciate all that you do for our students.
