Things to Remember

- Checks are printed on Tuesdays and Thursdays.
 - Documents must be submitted to AP before 2:00 p.m. to be included for check printing
- All documents must be signed and dated
- Original packing slips and receipts are needed for payment of physical goods
- Submit all documents to AP via **Red Folders** in interoffice mail.
- Electronic documents and signatures are only accepted for payment in emergency situations.
- Emergency situations include:
 - Payment required before physical documents will be delivered to AP via Red Folder
 - Payments for past due invoices

Dear TUHSD Staff,

This Memo is being sent to advise you about the District's policies and procedures for communicating effectively with the District's Limited-English Proficiency (LEP) parents. Pursuant to District Policy AC, *Nondiscrimination/Equal Opportunity*, the District will strive to ensure that applicants, students, and parents/guardians with LEP have meaningful access and an equal opportunity to participate in the educational programs, services, activities and other benefits offered by the District. TUHSD will make interpreters available to provide oral interpreting and/or written translation of documents, as is deemed necessary.

Generally, District Policy AC requires that interpreters, translators and/or other aids shall be provided to parents free of charge. Language assistance will be provided through use of competent bilingual staff, staff interpreters, contracts or arrangements with local organizations providing interpretation or translation services, or technology and telephonic interpretation services. TUHSD conducts periodic review of the language access needs of its student and parent/guardian population, as well as update and monitor the implementation of District Policy and related procedures.

You are expected to review and understand Policy AC and to ensure that LEP parents of your students, or LEP parents that you may come into contact with while working for the District, are provided with the opportunity for interpretation and/or translation services pursuant to District Policy. Este Memo se envía para informarle sobre las políticas y procedimientos del Distrito para comunicarse de manera efectiva con los padres del Distrito con Capacidad Limitada del Inglés (LEP). Conforme con la Póliza del Distrito AC, No discriminación / Igualdad de oportunidades, el Distrito se esforzará por asegurar que los solicitantes, estudiantes y padres / tutores con LEP tengan acceso significativo y una oportunidad equitativa de participar en los programas educativos, servicios, actividades y otros beneficios ofrecidos por el distrito. TUHSD pondrá a disposición intérpretes para proporcionar interpretación oral y / o traducción escrita de documentos, según se considere necesario.

Generalmente, la Póliza del Distrito AC requiere que se proporcionen intérpretes, traductores y / u otras ayudas a los padres sin costo alguno. La asistencia con el idioma se proporcionará mediante el uso de personal bilingüe que es competente, intérpretes del personal, contratos o arreglos con organizaciones locales que brinden servicios de interpretación o traducción, o servicios de interpretación telefónica y de tecnología. TUHSD lleva a cabo revisiones periódicas de las necesidades de acceso al idioma de su población de estudiantes y padres / tutores, así como también actualiza y monitorea la implementación de la Política del Distrito y los procedimientos relacionados.

Se espera que usted revise y comprenda la Política AC y se asegure de que los padres LEP de sus estudiantes, o los padres LEP con los que pueda tener contacto mientras trabaja para el Distrito, tengan la oportunidad de recibir servicios de interpretación y / o traducción de conformidad con la Póliza del Distrito.
