
• Luke AFB salutes essential workers with flyover



Luke Air Force Base, along with the Arizona National Guard 161st Air Refueling Wing will honor Arizona's front line COVID-19 responders with a community flyover this Friday, May 1, 2020. A formation of 15 aircraft will begin the flyover at approximately 3:10 p.m. and will last 50 minutes.

The flight path will go through Buckeye, Luke Air Force Base, Litchfield Park, Surprise, Waddell, Goodyear, Tolleson, Phoenix, Tempe, Chandler, Gilbert, Mesa, Scottsdale, Deer Valley, Glendale, Peoria, Sun City West, and El Mirage. Residents along the flight path can expect a few seconds of jet noise as the aircraft pass overhead.
